Tommie Kent Stoor, 29, of Star Route, Pocatello, passed away Wednesday evening of injuries received in a plane crash.

He was born May 24, 1945 at Soda Springs, the son of Vern and Jennie C. Averill Stoor and was reared at Soda Springs. He attended school at Soda Springs and graduated from high school there. For two years he was in the Navy and served ~~one and a half years in Vietnam~~. In 1969 he came to Pocatello and attended the Vo Tech at Idaho State University where he graduated as an aircraft mechanic.

On November 21, 1970 he married Nancy Bright at Pocatello, and in 1971 they moved to Afton, Wyoming where Mr. Stoor was employed as an aircraft mechanic for Aerotek. In March of 1972 they returned to Pocatello and since that time he has been employed as a pilot for Northwest Aviation.

Mr. Stoor was a member of the 35th Ward, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Survivors include his wife; a son, Jason Vern, 2; a daughter,

Shasta, 2 months, all of Pocatello; his parents of Soda Springs; two brothers, Gary, Soda Springs; Jack, Casa Grande, Arizona.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at 1:00 P.M. in the L.D.S. Thirty-fifth Ward Chapel at Quinn and Hawthorne Roads with Bishop Robert J. Allen officiating. Interment was in Restlawn Memorial Gardens with Military graveside rites by the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post 735, Al Phelan, Command and World War I Veterans, Harold Stoy, Commander.

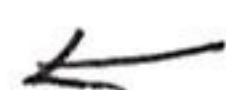
