The War Department listed yesterday the names of 21 soldiers with Virginia kin who are missing—one in the Southwest Pacific, nine in the European area and 11 in the Mediterranean area.

Charlottesville, Va., Aug. 8.—Mrs. Bessie Peregory of this city has been notified that her husband, First Sergt. Frank D. Peregory, was killed in France on June 14. Before entering the service, he was employed by the Barnes Lumber Co.

### Two Reliance Men Killed

Winchester, Va., Aug. 8.—Two Reliance soldiers have been reported by the War Department as killed in action. Mrs. H. M. Broy was advised that her son, Pvt. H. Nelson Broy, was killed in France on July 22. Mr. and Mrs. C. F. Cullers were notified that their son, Pfc. Hollie C. Cullers, died in action in Italy on July 11.

### Sergt. Harlan E. Kees

Martinsburg, W. Va., Aug. 8.—Sergt. Harlan E. Kees, 24, was killed in action with the infantry in France July 16, according to word received by his mother, Mrs. Nannie May Kees.

### Sergt. John C. Felix

Gettysburg, Pa., Aug. 8.—Sergt. John C. Felix, 22, son of Mrs. Virginia Felix, Greenmount, was killed in action in France on the night of July 12, according to a telegram received by his wife, Mrs. Mary Rita Felix, Emmitsburg. He was a graduate of Gettysburg High School in 1940 and was employed by the Fairchild company at Hagerstown, Md., before entering the service in January, 1943.

### Pvt. Martin Greenfield

Martinsburg, W. Va., Aug. 8.—Pvt. Martin Greenfield, 25, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harlan Greenfield, of this county, has been missing in action in France since July 8, according to a telegram from the War Department to his parents yesterday. He was a trackman on the B. & O. before entering service.
