In the Name of God amen I Avis Rudd of Chesterfield County calling to mind the frailty of this Life do ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following and first I give my Soul to God that gave it me in hopes of acceptance thereof though the merrits of Jesus Christ my Saviour and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be Buried by the Discretion of my Executors

Item I give to my grandson Thomas Frith five Pounds likewise I give to my grandson Fraderick Rudd five Pound likewise I give to my grandson William Rudd the son Thomas Rudd five pound likewise I I give to my grandson Son Daniel Brown five pound likewise I give to my Son Thomas Rudd all the hirds of my Estate Hogs Cattle & Horses

I Desire that there shall be no appraisement upon the Estate

I Nominate and appoint my Son Thomas Rudd my Hole and Sole Executor of this my last will Revoking and Disanulling all Wills heretofore by made in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my Seal this 27 day of September 1759
