shillings to be paid as aforesaid

I Give and bequeath unto my son Obadiah the sum of five Shilling

I Give and bequeath unto my son James five Shillings all  
current money of y<sup>e</sup> province aforesaid and paid by my Executors here  
after named - - - - -

I Devise and Dispose of all my lands to be sold by my  
dear and well beloved Wife Thomas Hachney & William  
Thomlinson who I Nominate Executrix & Executors of this  
my last will and Testament: and after the same is sold and  
my just debts and Legacies paid I give and bequeath the  
remainder unto my dear and well beloved Wife to  
whom I give my Negro Boy called Will In Witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this  
fourteenth day of September Anno: quo Dom one thousand seven  
hundred and thirty five


