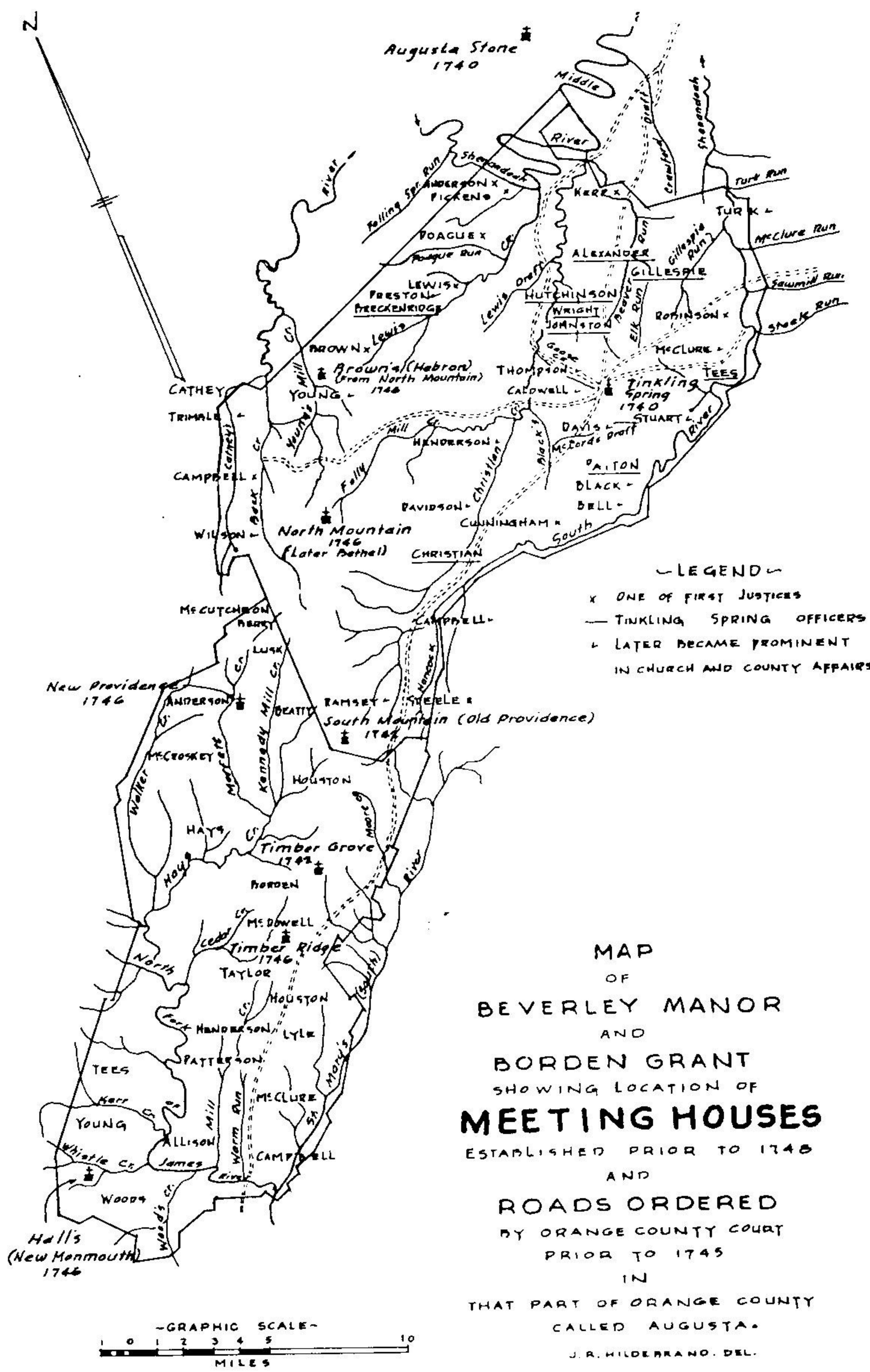


Young Family Land

In the mid-1700s Robert Young Sr resided in the Borden Tract in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia. By the late 1800s, his second great-grandson, William Sanford Young, owned land in north Georgia (in Walker County adjacent to the county line with Chattooga County).

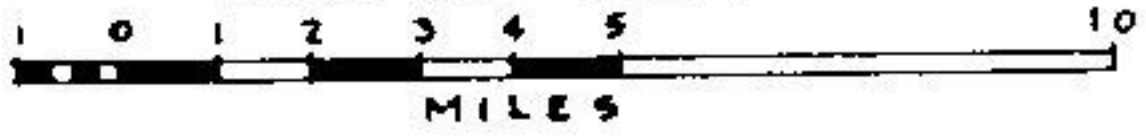

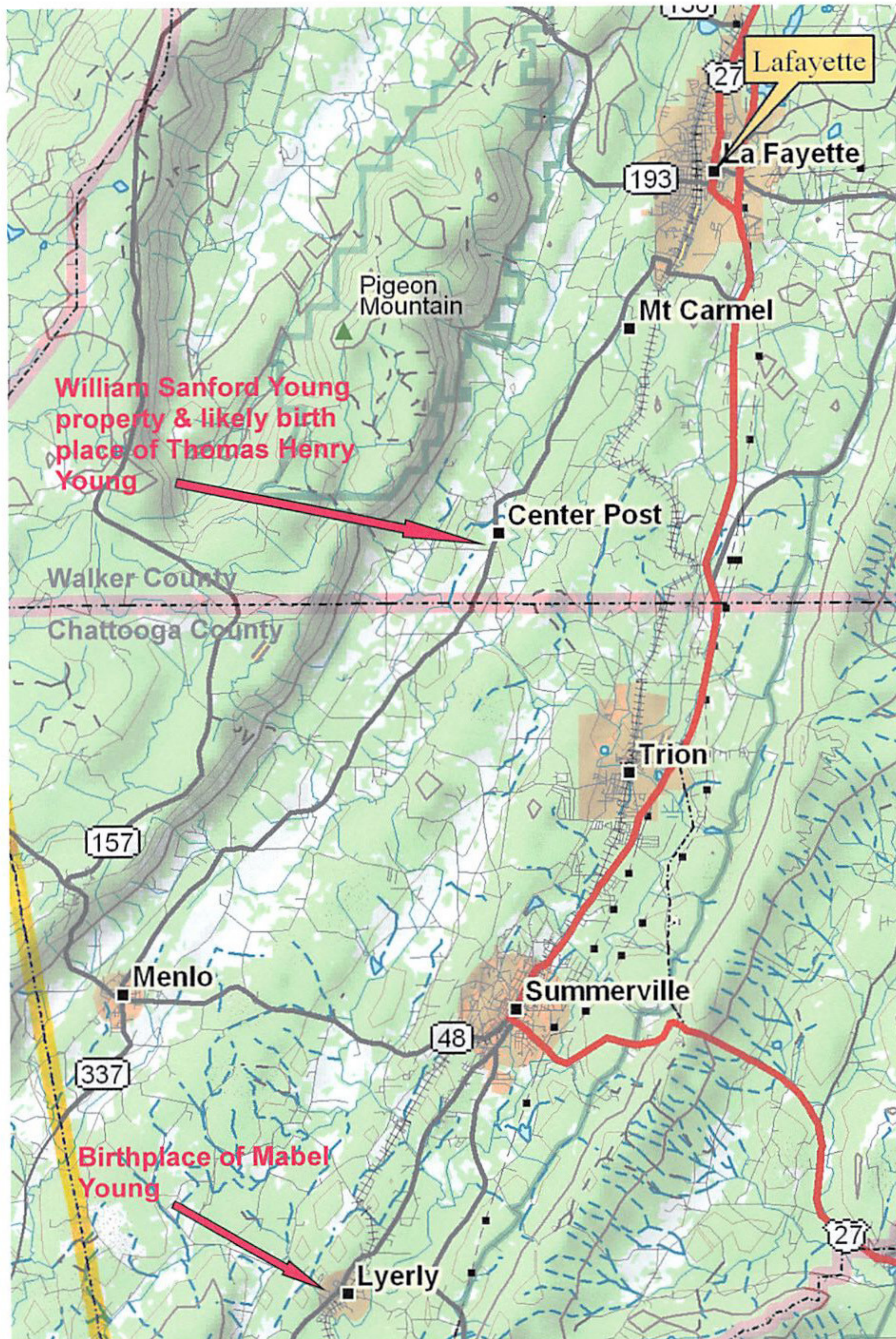

CALLED AUGUSTA.

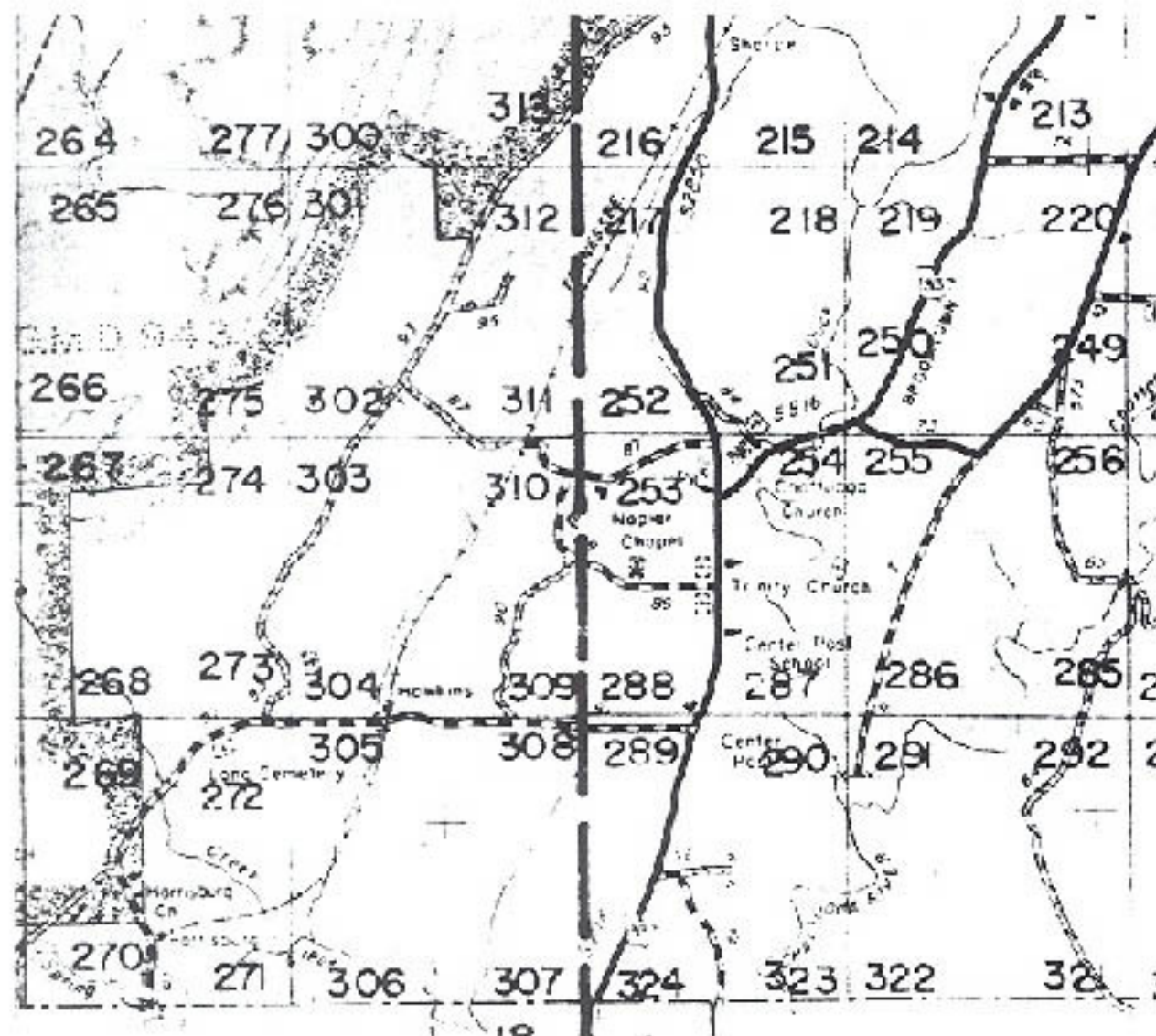
