Mr. Thomas A. Carter Dead.

Mr. Thomas A. Carter died at his home on East Market Street last Tuesday morning at six o'clock. He had been failing for sometime past, but a severe attack of pneumonia proved fatal in a few days.

Mr. Carter was born in Fauquier County, Va., sixty-seven years ago, and he had lived for several years in Loudoun. He was a confederate soldier, a member of Company A, 6th Virginia Cavalry, and went through the civil war as a brave and faithful soldier. He was also a Mason. Mr. Carter leaves a widow and eight grown children, five daughters and three sons. The funeral was held at his late home on Wednesday afternoon and was conducted by Rev. F. P. Berkley, and the interment was at Union Cemetery. The local Camp of Confederate Veterans and Lodge of Masons conducted the service at the grave.
