This photo/document album was prepared by Virginia Stoy Arnold, apparently starting in the early 1960s based on the dates of some of the photos and newspaper accounts. Her daughter, Ann Arnold Hennings, extended the album somewhat after Virginia's death in 1992.

I've scanned all of the pages except one or two that are duplicates of obituaries and photos that I personally have in my photo albums, and these pages are contained in this PDF file. However, all the original items are preserved in a new archival album I prepared that replaces the badly preserved original album (simply an old 3-ring school binder).

Virginia divided the album into several tabbed sections: Arnold Family, Hayes Family, Holmes/Jones Families, and the Stoy Family. I've maintained these divisions in the scanned file.

The new album will be given to the Virginia Room at the Fairfax Regional Library in Fairfax, Virginia, probably in early 2021.

# Mrs. Maud Smith Dies; 'Little Theater' Leader

Mrs. Maud Howell Smith, 91, known as Washington's "first lady of the stage," died yesterday at Sibley Hospital.

Mrs. Smith, who had been in the center of virtually all "little theater" activity in the Washington area for the last 70 years, had promoted since 1927 the One-Act Play Tournament, now sponsored by the District Recreation Department.

She was known to almost everyone connected with drama in the District for her encouragement and support of play groups throughout the area.

Mrs. Smith, known by many as "Aunt Maud," also was an active performer on the stage. For nearly 50 years she was in numerous plays with the old National Theater stock company, performed at the Sylvan Theater and was the Art Club's leading lady.

## Lynchburg Native

A native of Lynchburg, Va., Mrs. Smith began her professional acting career in an old English play, "Box and Cox," presented in a theater on the present site of the Hecht Co. store at 7th and F Streets NW.

This performance came while she also taught Sunday school classes at the old Grace Church at 9th and G Streets NW. Her grandfather, the Rev. John Howell, who lived in Alexandria, frequently preached at the Mount Vernon Place Church, and Mrs. Smith became interested in the church's amateur theatrical presentations.

Some of her favorite parts were with Helen Hayes in "Tintagles," as Parthenia, the Greek maiden, in "Ingomar," and her role in Mrs. Christian Hemmick's "The Opium Pipe." The vivacious actress also shared the stage with such stars as Edward Arnold, Ethel Barrymore and Helen Menken.

When the late Miss Sybil Baker conceived the idea for a One-Act Play Tournament almost 40 years ago, Mrs. Smith was called in to help. The

tournament today is one of the most important little theater events in the area.

## Testimonial Dinner

Shortly before her 90th birthday in 1964, she was honored by friends and colleagues as Washington's "First Lady of the Confederacy and the Theater" at a testimonial dinner.

Besides her fervent interest in the theater, Mrs. Smith was active in women's service work, and was always one of the first to join any group concerned with public service.

Mrs. Smith's husband, Eli Bamford Smith, a retired shoe business executive, died in 1959. She lived at 4000 Massachusetts Ave. NW.

She leaves a sister, Mrs. Ethel Kemon, of 2717 S. Arlington Ridge Road, Arlington, and three nieces, Mrs. Anna H. Conard of 860 S. Greenbrier St., Arlington; Mrs. Charles E. Hart of 1701 Oak Lane, McLean, Va., and Mrs. James Mays of 2717 S. Arlington Ridge Road.

Services will be held at Gawlers funeral home, Wisconsin Avenue and Harrison Street at 10 a.m. Monday. Burial will be in Glenwood Cemetery.

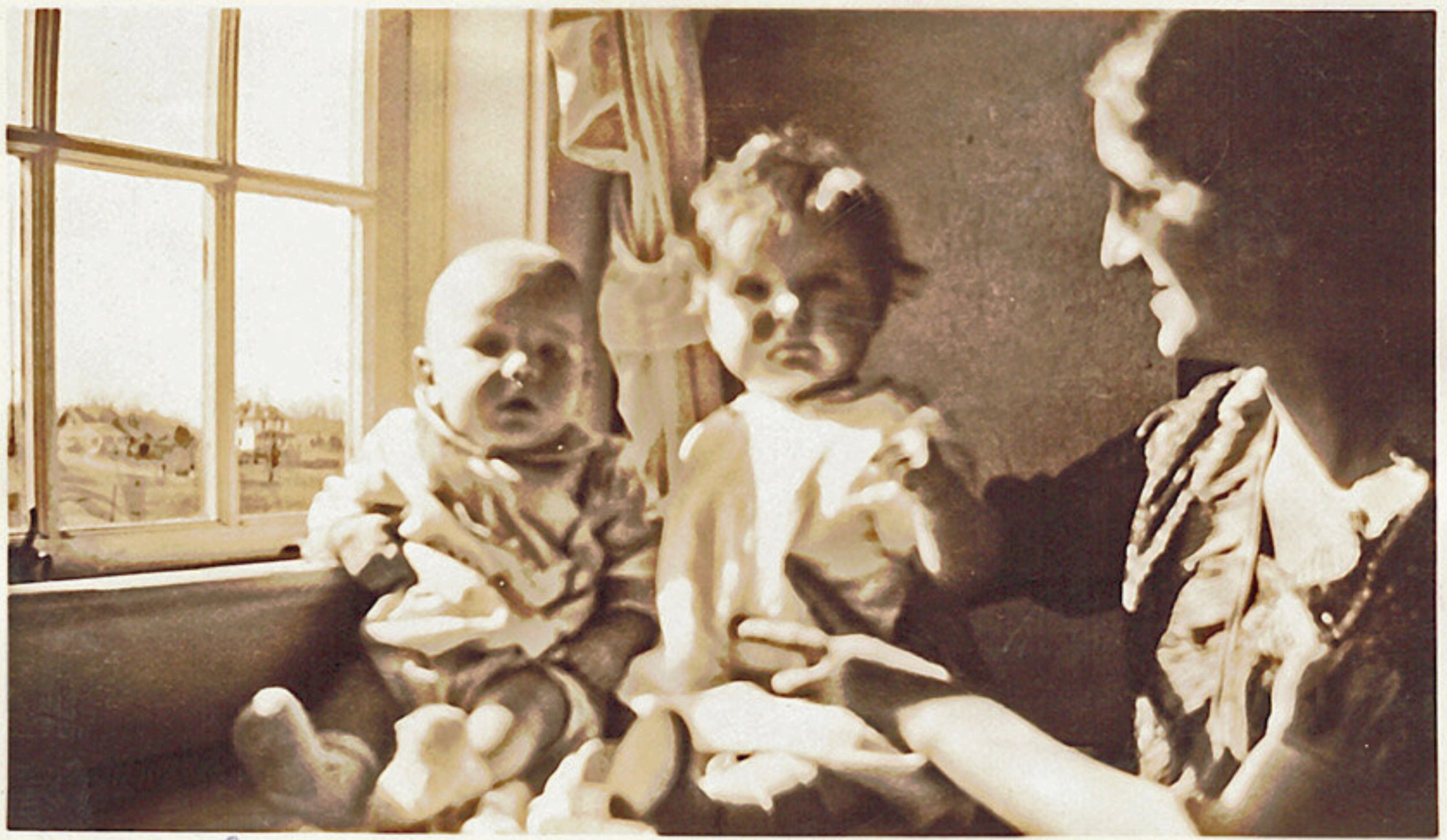
